



## Luke 22:1-38 – The Greatest Story

### Small Group Questions

Pray for God's help as you turn to look at His word, to understand and respond rightly to what you'll see. Read through the passage and then discuss these questions together.

- 1) What is your favourite story (book, film etc)? Is there an obvious climax to the story – a final confrontation of some kind?
- 2) Read the following verses: Luke 9:51; 22:1, 7, 14, 37. How do these verses show the direction Luke is taking in his presentation of the gospel story? What do they highlight as the key focus?
- 3) In verses 17–20, Jesus does something extraordinary: he makes the Passover meal about himself and speaks of a “new covenant.” How do these two themes — Passover and New Covenant — connect this moment to the wider story of the Bible? Why is this such a climactic moment in that story?
- 4) Read Jeremiah 31:31-34. Why is the New Covenant better than the covenants that come before it?
- 5) How can this give Christians deep security and joy?
- 6) Re-read Luke 22:19–20. Knowing what Jesus was about to do the next day, how do his words “for you” impact you personally as you hear them today?
- 7) Contrast the concerns of the disciples (vv4-6, v24, v34) with the concerns of Jesus in this passage. How does this contrast:
  - (a) expose things in your own heart that you want to repent of?
  - (b) highlight things you want to worship Jesus for and become more like him in?
- 8) What helps you remember and rejoice in the greatest story – what Jesus has done for us? Are there particular habits, Bible verses, hymns, or songs that help? What could you do this week to help your heart remember and rejoice in him?
